### 5 best places to tee it up in a vineyard

### 1. The Course at Wente Vineyards, Livermore, California:

Designed by Greg Norman, this championship golf course winds through Wente Vineyards, site of California's oldest continuously operated family-owned vineyards and winery. Finish with a cool glass of Wente chardonnay on the patio of the Clubhouse Grill, overlooking both vines and the 18th hole, www.wentegolf.com

### 2. Clos LaChance at CordeValle Resort, San Martin, California:

Picture-perfect Clos LaChance winery has 150 acres of vines that form a backdrop to Corde-Valle's championship course by legendary designer Robert Trent Jones. Get breathtaking views of links and rolling hills from the resort's ultra spacious accommodations, www.cordevalle.com www.clos.com

3. Rockway Glen, St. Catharines, Ont.: The winery, restaurant and the golf clubhouse share a building with a unique Antique Wine Museum. all perched by the Niagara Escarpment where the rolling landscape of the 18-hole golf course is bracketed by vineyards. www.rockwayglen.com 4. Viñas del Golf, Mendoza, Argentina: Tradi-

tional grills from their wood-fired clay oven, fresh organic orchard produce and Viñas del Golf wines are yours to enjoy at the Golf & Wine Lodge restaurant after whacking the little white
